Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs, Department of State; BS and MS degrees, The City College of New York; studied at University of Grenoble, France; PhD degree from New York University 1948; entered Foreign Service in 1948; served in embassies at Santiago, Chile, and Port-au-Prince, Haiti; served in Office of South American Affairs and in Office of West Coast Affairs, Department of State, 1950-54; attended National War College in Washington 1956-57; formerly Counselor of Embassy for Economic Affairs in Madrid, Spain.

RAYMOND E. CRIST

Research Professor of Geography at the University of Florida; Fulbright Award to conduct research project at the University of Toulouse, France, in 1959; educated at the University of Cincinnati, Cornell University, and Universities of Zurich, Switzerland; Bonn, Germany; and Grenoble, France; specialized in studies of land tenure systems under auspices of Institute of International Education, Guggenheim Foundation, Rockefeller Foundation, Social Science Research Council, and Creole Petroleum Corporation; author: LEARNING ABOUT LATIN AMERICA, LAND FOR THE FELLAHIN.
